Hoofing the Hood for the Neighborhood Good

	Make your exercise count even more. Exercise with good intent for your neighbors. Become a block leader with Neighborhood watch!	
2016 Wrapup	 This past year we've had a few crimes in the neighborhood. Mail theft Credit card fraud/ identity theft Vandalism/ unlocked cars being rifled. Domestic disputes Close by, a theft of a computer at Double Twist Hair Salon that contained their client database. 	
Suspicious Activity	Lately we've had a few complaints about suspicious people in the neighborhood. If you see someone who looks out of place please use 911 and report it. The Sheriff assures me that they would rather check out a crime before it happens than respond to it after it's occurred. They would like you to use the emergency number even if you don't feel it's warranted. They take suspicious behavior seriously and they want you to as well. Please let your block leader know if there is something you want to report.	
Safety Tips	 Here are some simple tips that may seem overly cautious but could prevent a potential crime Dogs are a deterrent to criminals if they bark! Turn on the radio or TV when you leave. It may make a possible intruder think there is someone home. Know your mail and package carriers schedule if possible. Don't leave your packages out for too long or your mail in the box for too long. Don't put outgoing mail in the box for too long before you expect the carrier. Ask your neighbors to pick up your package if you aren't going to be around. Call the sheriff and report when you will be gone and your home vacant for more than 2 weeks. they will patrol your home more frequently. Let your block Leader know you'll be gone also let them know if you have a house sitter. Lock your car if you park it outside and bring in garage door opener don't leave valuables in your car. Move your car, don't leave it in the same spot. Leaving your trash out the night before provides a tasty snack for javelina and lets criminals know you're not home or won't be getting up early. Ask a neighbor to return your trash and recycling cans if you leave them out and expect to be gone overnight. Be mindful of solicitors and repair personnel. Legitimate political canvassers or voter registration workers will have identification. Anyone who is selling or going to your home to repair something should have a company id and would not be offended by your asking for it. 	

	 If you are working in your backyard keep your front doors and gates locked. If your home security product uses batteries make sure that are good to go before you go. A security system with a dead battery is a s effective as a smoke alarm that needs a new battery. 	
Be a Block Leader	Do you walk the hood? How about doing it with good intent? Become a block leader for Neighborhood watch! You'll be helping your neighborhood while you benefit from the exercise. We are very shy on Neighborhood watch block leaders, especially in the area south of Snyder. Why not you? At maximum you will be asked to attend 2 meetings a year.
