

President's Message

Dear neighbors,			
Board Changes	It is with pleasure that I report significant changes to Hidden Valley's Board of Directors. As you remember from previous newsletters, Vince Schantz currently serving as Vice President and Pat Packard, Social Director, are moving. Bill Fee has agreed to become Vice President. Penny Larkin will move to the Social Director position. Carole Fee will assume duties of membership development and Bob Larkin will take on Neighborhood Watch Area Leader responsibilities. Thanks again to Pat and Vince for their very able service.		
Next Board Meeting	Our all volunteer HOA is dependent on the willingness of its' members to carry on the business of our organization. We so appreciate our current and new board members. Our next board of director meeting is March 27 at 7 pm at Pete and Linda Cinquemani's. Members are always welcome. If you can't make the meeting but have an item you want the board to discuss give me a call or send a note in advance of the meeting.		
Wes Miller Park	We hope you have had a chance to visit the park and see how open and accessible it is with the removal of dead trees, non native plants and debris. While a few people have complained that too much was removed, we want to assure you all that great care was taken to remove only what was necessary to clear paths and improve access. We consulted with the Forest Service, the Watershed Management Group and the Nature Conservancy before work was begun.		
Park Fund	Last year for the first time we created a separate fund just for the park. Thanks to your generous donations last year we raised \$1745. Here is what we spent on the park last year: \$880 cleanup; \$320 new park sign; professional survey to clarify property lines: \$750 for a total of \$1950. In 2017 you have donated \$1970. We expect to do more work in the parking lot area in 2017 again using crews working through the Forest Service. Pete is researching the possibility of erecting permanent pillars near the picnic area to which we could attach a shade canvas during events.		
Park Cleanup Day	We also have a spring cleanup day planned for Saturday, March 11 starting at 8AM. We will be removing debris and small limbs and branches. Refreshments will be provided. Volunteers of all ages are welcome to pitch in.		
Yard Waste Dumpster	A dumpster will be delivered to Wes Miller Park on March 9 for the exclusive use of member of the Hidden Valley Homeowners Association. The dumpster is for yard waste only. Please put nothing other than yard waste in the dumpster as there is a fine if other materials are found in the dumpster.
