If you have had occasion to visit Wes Miller Park you've noticed the rushing water in the creek and how the vegetation responded to our record monsoon season. Pete Cinquemani, our park director, is again contracting with the Forest Service to trim trees and remove more non native vegetation. The Forest Service hires prisoners soon to be released some of whom also are trained in fire fighting. This arrangement with the Forest Service has worked well for us in the past.

This number represents about half of the residents of our community. We also had excellent support for the Wes Miller Park fund with your contributions topping \$3370. All park donations go only to maintenance of the park.
