Recommended FY2024 Budget holds the line on tax rate

The recommended \$1.76 billion budget for next fiscal year focuses on maintaining County financial stability, funding critical infrastructure needs, tackling justice and law enforcement needs, and maintaining the County as an employer of choice in a highly competitive employment market that is seeing record levels of job vacancies across nearly all employment sectors, including local government.

Pima County partnership creates pipeline from high school to high-paying jobs

The Southern Arizona Manufacturing Partners (SAMP) is a partnership between schools and the local manufacturing industry that's facilitated by the County Community &

Workforce Development Department (CWD). CWD sets up summer internships for recent high school graduates and covers their tuition at Pima Community College during their internships. The SAMP partnership provides young adults opportunities for well-paying manufacturing careers they wouldn't have otherwise known were available.
