

County's detention facilities are 1st in state to gain access to federal STI resources

What's the difference between Pima County's detention facilities and a clinic for sexually transmitted infections? Not much, according to the federal government. Now, the Pima County Adult Detention Complex and Pima County Juvenile Detention Center are the first detention facilities in Arizona to be recognized as Covered Entities for participation in the <u>United States Health Resources</u> and Administration's 340B Drug Pricing Program.
