What exactly is a wildfire home assessment?

A home assessment is a review of the vulnerability of one's house and landscape to wildfire and ember-ignition. During the assessment, the assessor will review the home ignition zone principles and make specific recommendations based on the property and will take about 15 to 30 minutes to complete. A summary of the recommendations along with additional resources and materials is provided at the end of the assessment. The homeowner will be under no obligation to complete any of the recommendations.
