## Be Prepared: How Pima County keeps you safe throughout the monsoon

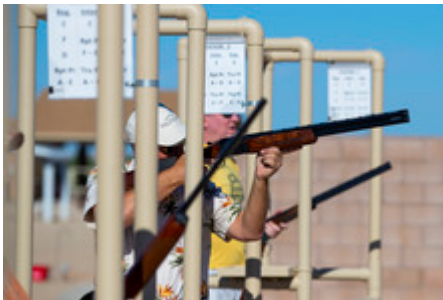
